As the 2018 fiscal year continues, so has child abuse in Greenville County, and our response to it. We are diligently increasing our efforts to protect, equip, and heal these vulnerable children as well as provide support for each family. From July - December 2017, we **served 227 clients** through our three key programs. This is a **7% increase** compared to this time last year. It's because of the support we receive from our donors, community partners, and volunteers that we are able to serve more children, teens, young adults, and families who need our help.
