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## Year of Growth at Pendleton Place

Thanks to the continued support from our donors and community, our programs continued to grow during the 2015 fiscal year. Each of the four programs (Connections Count, Assessment Center, Family Bridges, and Smith House) worked to provide a stable home environment and a bright future for each client.

Snapshot of this new growth:

- 555 individual clients served, comprising 185 families
- 278 children (birth-21 years of age)
- 277 adults

Includes:

- 152 kids and adults received comprehensive assessments to identify needs
- 28 families received safe, supervised visitation and/or custody exchanges
- 69 young adults, former foster care children or parents in crisis received case management and mentoring
- 3,464 nights of safe residential care for foster youth
